School, sports, and healthcare are important participation areas for adolescents with CP. To be able to truly understand and optimize their participation, it is necessary to switch our perspective. Let the adolescent with CP be the starting point. This perspective implies qualitative research with a focus on their experiences. But that is not all: it also implies research in which adolescents themselves play an active role in determining the design and outcomes.

## Participation of CP ambassadors in the project



### Participatory research:

- 10 ambassadors with CP
- as experts and as faces of the study
- are actively involved in research
- which is executed not only for them but with them
- in all phases of the project: from design to outcomes

#### Design:

- a 10-year follow-up of PERRIN
- 30 40 adolescents (12-17 years) with CP
- open interviews
- focus on participation
- qualitative analyses

## **Expected outcomes:**

- experiental knowledge and practical recommendations, about partcipation at school, at sports and in healthcare
- insights in the process of executing participatory research with adolescents with CP
